THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT - In today's gospel reading we hear of Jesus cleansing the Temple. The Temple was, for the Jewish people, the holiest place on earth. It was the House of the Lord. Its purpose was for the worship of God, and for that alone. Nevertheless, in the not too far distant future, this great Temple will be one day torn down by the Romans – in the not far too distant future by the Romans. But by then, it's purpose will already have become apart of the past – as Jesus was now the true Temple – for in him the true God dwelt. This Temple would itself be torn down on Good Friday – but recreated anew at Easter in the resurrection.

St Paul, in his letter to the Corinthians, said to his listeners and readers: 'Do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit? Through our baptism, the Holy Spirit has entered our hearts and lives.

Lent is a time when we are encouraged to make our Easter Duties. One of these duties is to seek the Lord's mercy in the Sacrament of Mercy – Confession. It's the easiest of things to avoidas nobody knows, apart from Our Lord. Nevertheless, it is so important – for it is the removal, through God's grace, of everything that has no place in the Temple of the Christian heart. Confession is a cleansing of that Temple – the place where God, in his mercy, has deigned to make his home.

Exodus 20:1-17

God spoke all these words. He said, 'I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

'You shall have no gods except me.

'You shall not make yourself a carved image or any likeness of anything in heaven or on earth beneath or in the waters under the earth; you shall not bow down to them or serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God and I punish the father's fault in the sons, the grandsons, and the great-grandsons of those who hate me; but I show kindness to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

'You shall not utter the name of the Lord your God to misuse it, for the Lord will not leave unpunished the man who utters his name to misuse it.

'Remember the sabbath day and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work, but the seventh day is a sabbath for the Lord your God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

Gospel

John 2:13-25

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money-changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.
