THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD - Christmas decorations have been disappearing fast as people tire of them – maybe because some have been up since the middle of November! So, for many, it seems that Christmas is done and dusted! But we, as the Christian faithful, are still in the midst of the Christmas celebration. Today we commemorate the visit of those variously called the Magi, the Three Kings or Wise Men who offer their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to the infant Lord. For many Catholic and Orthodox people in different parts of the world, it is today's feast - more so than Christmas Day - that is kept with the greatest solemnity, and is often the day for the giving and receiving of gifts.

On Christmas night the new-born Saviour was shown first to the people of Israel in the person of the shepherds. Now, with the visit of the Magi from the East, the Christ-child is shown to those outside the confines of Israel or the Jewish faith – the Gentiles – of which most Christians are part. The Epiphany could then be called the *Christmas of the Gentiles*.

This 'showing' or 'epiphany' to the gentiles in the person of the Magi prefigures the preaching of Christ's death and resurrection of St Paul - for his mission was to preach the gospel to the pagan nations and be the Apostle to the Gentiles.

THE BLESSING OF CHALK - It has long been a tradition that chalk is blessed at Epiphany Mass, and that we take a piece home with us to invoke a blessing on our homes for the New Year that has begun. You use the blessed chalk to write above the doorway of your home: 20+C+M+B+24

As you do so, another says the following prayer, invoking God's blessing:

The three wise men

- (C) Caspar
- (M) Melchior and
- (B) Balthasar

followed the star to God's Son who became man

- (20) Two thousand and
- (24) twenty-four years ago.
- + May Christ
- + bless our home
- + and remain with us throughout the New Year.
- +Amen

We then say the following prayer:

Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your Only Begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern and care for others may reflect your love. Bless this household with health, goodness of heart, and the keeping of your commandments. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. Our Father. Hail Mary. Glory be.

Entrance Antiphon

Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion.

Collect

O God, who on this day revealed your Only Begotten Son to the nations by the guidance of a star, grant in your mercy, that we, who know you already by faith, may be brought to behold the beauty of your sublime glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First reading

Isaiah 60:1-6

Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples. Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness. Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and your daughters being tenderly carried. At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow to you, the wealth of the nations come to you; camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord.

All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord. R./

Second reading

Ephesians 3:2-3,5-6

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Jesus Christ, through the gospel.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! We saw his star as it rose and have come to do the Lord homage. Alleluia!

Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah, for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward, and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Prayer over the Offerings

Look with favour, Lord, we pray, on these gifts of your Church, in which are offered now not gold or frankincense or myrrh, but he who by them is proclaimed, sacrificed and received, Jesus Christ. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Communion Antiphon

We have seen his star in the East, and have come with gifts to adore the Lord.

Prayer after Communion

Go before us with heavenly light, O Lord, always and everywhere, that we may perceive with clear sight and revere with true affection the mystery in which you have willed us to participate. Through Christ our Lord.
