THANK YOU - The Archbishop has written to thank all those who played some part in the recent parish visitation. He is grateful for those who played their part in the liturgies of the weekend, and to those who attended and helped at the meeting at St Joseph's and the lunch at St John's. The Archbishop will forward a report of the parish visitation in the coming weeks, and this will go towards the wider report which will focus on the needs, weaknesses and strengths of the deanery parishes as a whole, which stretch from Rugby down to Bicester.

THE SEASON OF LENT - This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and one of the two days of fasting and abstinence binding on Catholics. As it is school half term Masses- with the imposition of ashes - will be at different times to enable as many of you as possible to mark this first day of Lent. Thank you to those who brought last year's palm branches in to burn for the ashes that we will receive on this day.

During Lent there will also be Stations of the Cross on Fridays and Sundays, the Early Bird Mass on Fridays at 6.45am, and the Wednesday Lent Group on prayer led by Fr Sean.

For personal devotion, you might like to take the Walk With Me booklet available at the back of church that will be an invaluable daily guide through this sacred season. Also, we are so fortunate that St John's and St Thomas's churches are open each day for private prayer and visits to the Blessed Sacrament. Do make good use of these open doors, especially during this season of Lent.

Lent is also the time when we are called to repentance, and so there will be the weekly times of Confession as well as a Penitential Service towards the end of Lent.

The word Lent is derived from lengthening – the season when, after the dark days of winter the days begin to lengthen, heralding the season of spring. Lent echoes this, and so is a time for growth....and a little pruning! It is for this growth and pruning that the Church has long given us those three Lenten disciplines of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving.

Time flies – so do your very best to make this Lent a Good Lent!

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.

'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart: he must live outside the camp.'
