JUBILEE YEAR PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM - Next year, 2025 is a Jubilee Year for the whole Catholic Church. There is a possibility of a Banbury pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham as part of these Jubilee Year celebrations. The proposed dates are Friday 18th to Sunday 20th July.

The Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham dates from the year 1061, and is therefore among the oldest sites of pilgrimage in Europe.

It is known as England's Nazareth, for the Lady of the Manor – Richeldis - was taken in spirit to the Holy House at Nazareth, and was asked by Our Lady to build a replica of this house where Mary encountered the Angel Gabriel, and where, through her 'yes', the Word was made Flesh. The original shrine was destroyed by the reformers during the reformation, but devotion was revived in the 19th century. For many who have been to Walsingham their experience has often been a day pilgrimage – which by its nature is fairly rushed and involving a lot of travel.

This pilgrimage will give the opportunity to savour what is a lovely area, with great history and importance for us as Catholics.

A pilgrimage is not a retreat, so whilst there we will have Mass, Evening Prayer, Rosary, Processions and Benediction, there will also be opportunity for relaxation and socialising in what is a beautiful Norfolk village.

The estimated cost is approximately £300. This will include coach transport (which is now the most expensive item), Dinner & B&B on Friday and Saturday, and Sunday lunch. There are a variety of ensuite single and twin rooms.

We first need to know if this is viable as we will have to pay deposits to guarantee the rooms. If you could email the office and let Fr Philip know if you are pretty interested, and would be likely to go, by 27th of October so that we can decide on whether it's worth pursuing.

NOVEMBER BLESSING OF GRAVES - This is a beautiful and poignant way of marking the Month of the Holy Souls. We will gather at Hardwick Hill cemetery on Sunday November 3rd at 2pm, and at Southam Road at 2pm on Sunday November 10th. It begins with a few prayers for the faithful buried there and those who mourn, and a scripture reading that speaks of our Christian hope in the face of death. After the short liturgy families/ friends go to the grave of their loved one, and the clergy will come around and bless each of their graves in turn. Hopefully it will be a source of consolation, and a happy thought that, after we have gone, friends or family might visit our graves to pray for us. Previously it was held on Saturday which seemed difficult for many, so we will try Sunday – appropriately the day of the Lord's resurrection.

All Souls Day this year will fall on a Saturday November 2nd, so the 10am Mass that day will be a Requiem Mass at which we will pray by name for all whose funeral rites were celebrated in the parish this past year.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2025 - Application forms will be available for collection at the end of Masses from one of the clergy on the weekends 20th and 27th October. They will need to be returned completed by Sunday 17th of November.

The sessions will all take place on Saturday mornings during school term time. If it isn't possible for your child to commit to this for this year, then they can delay preparing for Holy Communion to the following year. The earliest children can make their first Holy Communion in this diocese is Year 3 of primary school.

Preparation will begin at the end of November, and all dates will be sent to you once your child's application has been processed.

CONFIRMATION - No dates have been proposed for this by the Bishop as yet. When we have news we will communicate it at Mass as usual.

Gospel

Mark 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
