PASSIONTIDE – The final two weeks of Lent, beginning on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, is Passiontide, wherein the Church particularly commemorates the suffering of Christ. The second week of Passiontide is Holy Week, ending on Holy Saturday. During this particularly sombre time, crucifixes and images are covered in purple veils until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

LENTEN PENITENTIAL SERVICE – Fri 22nd March at 6pm in St John's Church. Priests from outside of Banbury will be available to hear confession for Lent in addition to our own priests. We should, as Catholics, as a bare minimum, go to confession once a year to confess any serious (mortal) sins. Lent is a great time to go and make ourselves spiritually ready to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection.

VISITING THE SICK AND HOUSEBOUND – There are many sick or housebound parishioners who are unable to attend Holy Mass, but would love to be able to receive Holy Communion in their homes. At present, we do not have nearly enough lay ministers of Holy Communion. Would you be willing to serve Christ with the sick in this way? To find out more, come to the meeting on <u>Tue 26th March</u> at 7pm in The Dupuis Centre.

GOOD FRIDAY ECUMENICAL WALK OF WITNESS – The walk begins at 11.15am, meeting outside of The People's Church and finishing with refreshments at St John's Church. Our own parish youth group have created an incredible life-sized crucifix which will be used for the procession. Here's three great reasons for you to attend:

- 1. Support our parish youth group.
- 2. Support Christian unity in Banbury.
- 3. Bear witness to our Lord in Banbury on Good Friday, the day he died for love of us.

BLESSING OF FOOD (IN ENGLISH) – The traditional Eastern European blessing of Easter food will take place at midday on Holy Saturday at St Joseph's Church. This blessing will be in the English Language.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY – 3pm Holy Hour at St John's with devotions to the Divine Mercy, Benediction, Confessions and the Blessing of Divine Mercy Images.

St. Faustina, who received visions from Jesus, wrote in her diary that He said: "I want the Image to be solemnly blessed on the first Sunday after Easter [now called Divine Mercy Sunday], and I want it to be venerated publicly so that every soul may know about it... I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." According to the vision, those who receive communion and attend confession on the Feast of Mercy receive total forgiveness of sin and it effects on us.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA — 8am every morning from Good Friday until Holy Saturday at St John's Church. A recording will be available online.

Jesus asked that Divine Mercy Sunday be preceded by a Novena, beginning on Good Friday. He said: "On each day of the Novena you will bring to My heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy ... On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My passion, for the graces for these souls." The last day has most difficult intention, for the lukewarm and indifferent. He said: "These souls cause Me more suffering than any others".

ALTAR SERVING FOR HOLY WEEK – Altar Servers have a hugely important role in the Holy Week celebrations. There is a sign-up sheet in the Sacristy for those who can serve. There will be a rehearsal before each of the main Liturgies, Maundy Thursday, 4.30pm at both St. John's and St. Joseph's, Good Friday, 1pm at both St. John's and St. Joseph's and Holy Saturday, 10.30am at St. John's.

First reading

Jeremiah 31:31-34

See, the days are coming — it is the Lord who speaks — when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel (and the House of Judah), but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive — it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. 'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown. And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
